

Thank you for registering your child with the Ashland Youth Indoor Soccer League.

With a few modifications, your child will be playing futsal, which is a little different than outdoor soccer, and very different from other indoor experiences.

**First:**

A futsal ball is a low bounce ball that forces players to use teammates and individual ball skill to advance the play to the goal. Team work is very important in this game.

**Second:**

The game is very fast paced. Endurance and stamina are necessary.

**Third:**

This type of game is used to improve performance on many levels. Players must make fast decisions and solve problems using intuition.

**Player Equipment and Game Day Concerns:**

The players must wear the following in order to play the game:  
tennis shoes or indoor shoes (no black soles)  
skin guards  
shorts  
white tee shirt (unless the team has an approved color to wear)

**No one may bring a ball to the games.**

Players may warm up in the hallways before games, but no soccer balls. No skateboarding or other unauthorized recreational activities will be allowed. Anyone who violates normal school rules will be asked to leave the premises.

We are guests. In order to continue to be permitted to use the gym space, everyone must treat the facilities and the league representatives with respect.

**Division I players will be given a snack and a drink after the games.**

Practices are optional. However, teams that are registered with travel/ club teams should expect to have practice and following the rules of their respective clubs.

Your coach should be in contact with you soon.

Please understand that this is a busy time for everyone and not all coaches will be able to contact everyone in a timely manner.

## **Inclement Weather**

## **Schedule**

1-Jan

This is an open day for practice  
It is not a mandatory day for participation.  
If possible, please contact your coach if you will not be there.

8-Jan

This is the official beginning of the futsal experience.  
Players will have brief/ informal practice or warm up then scrimmage.  
This is the last day for any major changes.

Practice

Most recreational teams will not practice.  
Practice is not mandatory for participation in the game.  
It is the option of the team and/or the coach to practice.  
It is recommended that ALL travel teams take advantage of the practice schedule during the winter season.

15-Jan

First day of games begin. All games will end on-time.  
To ensure that your child gets the proper experience, please make sure that s/he arrives in enough time to warm up and play the game as scheduled.  
There will be no extensions to game time.  
It takes approximately 15 minutes to properly warm up for a game.  
Warm ups are not necessary for U-10 players, but it is helpful to start the routine.

## **INDOOR Soccer 2005/06, Sponsored by the AYSL**

### **Code of Conduct**

1. The Administrators and Team Officials must conduct themselves in such a manner as to set an example that if followed would enable every player to be a credit to the game.
2. Players may not bring soccer balls to the games. Players may warm up in the hallways just outside of the gyms, but they may not use a ball to do so.
3. Players and Spectators must enter and exit the New Gym the same way. No one is allowed to exit the gym by going into the lobby.

### **League Standings**

4. Records of games will not be kept.
5. Records will not be kept for the sake of determining a champion or winning team.
6. It is important to remember that this is a recreational activity and that the purpose of the league is for enjoyment of the game and the promotion of soccer skills in game-like situations.

### **Clubs & Team Responsibilities**

7. All teams wishing to play in the AYSL Indoor League must be duly registered with the League and must pay the prescribed fees.
8. A team may register and play up to ten (10) players. If more than 10 players are requested on a team, please contact the Indoor executive for approval. Teams may register colors by contacting the Indoor Soccer League administration. Not all requests will be honored. If the team does not have a designated color, then all players must wear white tee-shirts. Colored vests will be used to distinguish between teams.
9. A player can only play for one (1) team.
10. Lateral movement of players between teams in the same "age division" shall NOT be permitted.
11. A player must be in possession of all the documents required by the AYSL.

All teams must accept and play any player that the AYSL adds to the team. This is done to encourage fair play and to help build a soccer community.

12. If a player's name appears on the game sheet, then he/she is considered to have played in that game. Only the players and officials named on the game sheet shall be permitted to play and stay on the bench.

13. Number of players allowed on the playing field. Each team will play with a maximum of five (5) field players and one (1) goalie, for a total of, not more than, six-a-side (6 players). These numbers may decrease as prescribed by the board and/or executive of the indoor soccer league.

14. The minimum number of players required on the field of play are four (4) for divisions III and above.

15. Teams are expected to play only the players that are on their rosters. If a change needs to be made, please contact the Indoor Coordinator and make any necessary arrangements. Please understand that not all requests may be honored, and only the requests that affect the least number of participants will be considered.

### **Team Colors and Uniform**

16. All players must wear indoor shoes or tennis shoes: no black soles and no cleats. Every player must wear shin guards and socks that cover the shin guards. If the team has not registered a color, the players must wear white tee-shirts. Colored vests will be used to distinguish between teams.

16.1.1. Players who wear glasses must use athletic sports goggles (metal frames are not permitted).

16.1.2. Players should wear white tee-shirts to each game. Colored practice vests will be provided to distinguish teams.

16.1.3. Teams that wish to register their own colors must contact the AYSL coordinator and receive prior approval before dressing in any color other than white.

### **League Structure**

17. The age divisions will be provided for each major and minor age group as per AYSL rules provided that the number of teams registered will support the division. A minimum of 3 teams will constitute a division.

### **Rules of the Game, League and Cup Competition.**

18. Length of games and game times will be determined by the Indoor Soccer League administration. No additional time will be awarded for games that start late. For all involved, please respect the times and be prompt to all games.

18.1.1.Division V. Games will consist of two 20 minute halves. No half time. At the half mark, teams will switch sides and resume play. Teams play with 5 field players and 1 goalie.

18.1.2.Divisions III and IV. Games will consist of two 18 minute halves seperated by a 1 minute half time. Teams switch sides at the half mark. Teams play with 5 field players and 1 goalie.

18.1.2.1.1. Division III only. No player may play in the goal for more than ½ of the game.

18.1.3.Divisions I and II. Games will consist of four 8 minute quarters, seperated by 1 minute periods. Teams switch sides between the second and third quarter only. Teams play with 4 field players.

18.1.3.1.1. Division II only. Teams play with a keeper (in addition to the 4 field players). The goalie may only play for one quarter per game.

**19.** All games must start promptly and not later than five minutes after the scheduled kick off time. No further grace period will be given to a late arriving team. **All games that start late will end at their scheduled times.**

20. The visiting team kicks off. The ball may be kicked in any direction, forward, backward or sideways to start the game. A goal may be scored from the kickoff, except in divisions I and II. The visiting team is listed second on the schedule.

21. The ball must stay within the boundaries to be considered playable. There will be no wall play, with the exception of division II. In division II, players may play the bleachers marking one of the sidelines.

22. If the game is tied after the full game is played, then the score will remain as stands.

### **Substitutions**

23. Teams can substitute on the “fly” at all times including the goalkeeper for whom the referee must be notified. Play will only be held up for substitution at restart because of an injury.

24. The referee may stop the time at his/her discretion otherwise the clock will be running at all times.



25. Player leaving the field of play must be within the touchline nearest to his/her bench area. Failing to do so will result in "too many players" on the field and a minor penalty of two minutes will be given to the incoming player. All players must enter and exit from their bench area. The player being substituted for must be out of the field of play before the new player may enter the game. Failure to observe this rule may result in a 1 minute penalty for which the team will have to play down a player.

### **Ball Size**

26. The League shall provide the match ball which will be properly inflated and conform to the stipulated: SIZE 3 futsal for U-11, SIZE 4 futsal for all other divisions.

### **Ball out of play**

27. The ball is out of play when:

27.1.1.1. it hits the wall above the bleachers or hits the top side of the bleachers.

27.1.1.2. it hits the lights or any part of the ceiling.

27.1.1.3. it completely crosses the endline of either goal.

27.1.1.4. it stops or slows down next to the side exit doors.

27.1.1.5. any time the referee determines that it is in a dangerous position and is best left up to a restart.

27.1.1.6. It crosses the sidelines as per FIFA regulations.

28. Restarts. In Divisions I and II, all restarts are indirect. In Divisions III and above, restarts will follow FIFA standards with the following exceptions.

28.1.1.1. At the side lines- kicked in by the opponents of the player who last touched the ball

28.1.1.2. at a corner- kicked in by the attacking team. Teams may score from a corner kick, except in divisions I and II.

28.1.1.3. at a goal kick- by placing the ball on the ground within the goal area and kicked into the field of play by the defending team. The ball must be played into the defensive half before it may cross the half line.

28.1.1.4. Goalies may not punt the ball. The goalie must distribute the ball to a player on his own half either by throw on ground pass. The goalie may not send the ball past his own half.

29. There will be no offside or three-line rule.

30. More rules will be posted for divisions IV and V as the season progresses. Understand that the futsal experience should be unique. These new rules will be used to enhance the level of play and add excited opportunities for the children to learn and develop problem-solving skills.

### **Fouls & Misconduct**

31. The rules of fouls and misconduct are the same as Outdoor penal offences and technical offences but with one additional change. SLIDE TACKLES ARE NOT ALLOWED.

32. If a player receives two (2) caution (yellow) cards in a game it will be equal to an ejection (red) card and the player will immediately retire from the team bench and be subject to an automatic game suspension from the next league game. Teams will play shorthanded for a duration of five (5) minutes for this penalty.

33. There will be no wall play, with the exception of division II, where players may play the bleachers that outline one of the sidelines.

34. Any indirect free kick awarded to the attacking team occurring inside the penalty area will be taken from any point on the line of the penalty area. Penalty kicks will be taken from the foul line.

35. Referees may assess a two-minute penalty for an offence, a caution (yellow) card, or both. Teams will play short handed for the duration of the penalty time issued.

36. If in the opinion of the referee an offence committed in the penalty area is serious, the referee may award a penalty kick PLUS a two minute or five minute penalty.

### **Penalties**

37. Penalty times are awarded in the following manner:

37.1.1. Referee discretion - two minutes

37.1.2. Caution (yellow card) - two minutes

Ejection (second yellow card) - five minutes

Ejection (red card) - five minutes.

38. Only two players from each team can be serving penalties at any one time. Any others must continue to play until the team's first penalty expires, then this player must retire to the penalty box.

39. In the case of an ejection that causes the team to have less than the minimum number of players on the field, the penalized team will forfeit the game and the opposing team will be awarded the game by a score of 3-0.

40. Offsetting major penalties will require that both teams play shorthanded for the duration of the penalty time.

41. A penalty shot will be awarded for kicking, tripping, pushing, and handling in the goal box.

### **Delay of the game**

42. If in the opinion of the referee a player is deliberately delaying the game, the referee may award a caution (two minute penalty) for: taking more than six (6) seconds to put the ball back into play from a free kick or for failing to respect the required distance (10 feet) from the ball on a free kick.

43. Another player on the field of play may serve a time penalty for a goalkeeper. The time penalty does not expire if a goal is scored.

44. In the event of an "ejection/dismissal" an alternate player may not serve time in the penalty box. The penalized team will play shorthanded for the duration of the time penalty (five minutes).

### **Bench**

45. Anyone who leaves the team bench and enters the field of play during an altercation will receive an automatic caution (two minutes or more) at the referee's discretion. Only registered team players and officials (coach, asst. coach, and manager) are allowed on the team benches but their names must be recorded on the game sheet.

46. Spitting is not permitted at any time.

### **Discipline**

47. All discipline matters will be dealt with in accordance with the AYSL rules and regulations. Ex. First red card- one game suspension, second red card – two game suspension etc.

### **Postponements and rescheduling**

48. Coaches and team officials are not permitted to postpone or reschedule any games under the jurisdiction of the AYSL.

49. It is the League's general policy to adhere to the schedule as printed.

50. ONLY the Indoor Soccer League Coordinator will reschedule games due to unforeseen cancellations or other serious matters.

### **Dropouts**

51. Should any team drop out of the League, all games played by that team shall be declared null and void in the League standings.

### **Protests, Disputes and appeals**

52. No protests will be accepted. All complaints, comments, and requests must be forwarded to or addressed to the Indoor Coordinator. However, for the sake of the children, we ask that negative remarks remain unspoken unless they will be beneficial to every child in the league. Game play is suppose to be fun. Let's keep it that way.

### **Referees**

53. The Referee Coordinator shall appoint referees in all games. If no qualified referee is available to officiate a game, the game has to be postponed unless both coaches agree and sign the game sheet indicating their consent for some other person to officiate. Teams agreeing on another person refereeing their game shall not be allowed to protest against such person.

54. Referees shall be suitably attired. Referees shall meet the minimum certifications required by Recreational League Standards as noted by the Ashland Youth Soccer League.

55. Referees shall keep a record of the game, time, score and goal scorers.

56. The referee in writing to the Indoor Coordinator shall report any action detrimental to the game.

### **Serious Misconduct**

57. Violence of any nature does not have a place in soccer. The AYSL Indoor League Executive will adopt a zero tolerance attitude.

**58.** Any game not completed due to an occurrence of any type of serious misconduct such as violent conduct, fighting, assaults or spectator problems may lead to the guilty team being removed from the league for the rest of the season.

**Other Matters**

59. Any situation not covered by the AYSL rules or Indoor League rules may be discussed and ruled upon by the Indoor Executive committee and shall be decided as per the Constitution of the Association.

60. The foregoing rules and regulations may be changed at any time by a majority vote of the Indoor League Executive or by AYSL board members.
